## Notes

Neville Chamberlain became Prime Minister and leader of a coalition government. He had previously served as MP for Ladywood, Birmingham - championing so many public services. Weoley Castle Estate being a prime example of development to aid city slum-clearance. The trip to Munich was an attempt to avert world war II. His 'Peace For Our Time' policy had majority backing in the House. This was short lived and soon fell out of favour.

In 1935, Neville Chamberlain opened Birmingham's 10,000th council dwelling at 30, Hopstone Road on the Weoley Castle Estate. (Wikipedia)
