## **DAD'S LANE ESTATE (AREA 4)**

I was struck by the similar architecture of all the council houses, which is typical of other estates built around that time. The blocks of 4 houses at corners are diagonally placed and there are blocks of 4 or 6 along the streets, which were built in 1931.

All the houses on the estate are similar, with plenty of trees and green spaces. It has a pleasant feel to it, safe, quiet, old fashioned, clean and respectable.

- 1 The new Pineapple Station, be a long time till it's finished!
- The view down Cartland Road, which is named after Major Cartland, father of Barbara. Council houses are on the right hand side.
- 3 Lyndworth Road, many council houses are now purchased and a whole variety of refurbishments are seen.
- 4 Diagonal corner block. Avebury Road.
- 5 Some houses are very smart and modern.
- 6 Beautifully arranged trees some grown large now.
- 7 Ashbrook Grove, a cul de sac with a nice central lawn.
- 8 Ashbrook Road, a block of 6.
- 9 The famous Dad's Lane Chippy, corner of Ashbrook Road and Dad's Lane.
- A wild flower patch by the river with the back of the chippy, the Highbury pub and the back of the first houses on Ashbrook road.
