All the built environment is on the north side of the A45, Small Heath Highway (by-pass), and all the foliage covered ones on the southern side, which is bordered by the River Cole and the railway for a great part of it.

1 shows the Asda at Heybarnes Circus, the large roundabout, where the bypass re-joins the old Coventry Road.

2 The old Webster and Horsfall building peeps through the greenery, the company that made the first successful transatlantic underwater cable.
